Reflection: Ingrid Turner

About eight years ago, I attended my 20-year high school reunion. It was a semi-formal affair in the function room of a local RSL Club. As I prepared for it, I felt very nervous, as I had not seen the majority of these women in twenty years. I was still scared to face the bullies and the judgemental eyes of the 'in' group. I hoped that my old friends from the rather unpopular 'daggy' group would be there; I sometimes felt a little sad that we had all moved away from each other when taking our various adult paths.

How would I go? Would anyone really want to speak with me? Could I present myself as a success? I was pregnant, yet still overweight. There were not too many traces of old age, but no raging career successes either. "For heaven's sake," I thought, "just go and don't expect anything, woman! Who cares? And anyway, I won't see them, maybe ever, again."

Jesus got a poor reception to his preaching when he visited his hometown in one of the Texts of this month. While his townsfolk found his preaching and healing inspiring, they couldn't get past the fact that he was Mary's son and a mere carpenter. It seemed they were distracted by the shallow value system that I had immersed myself in as I faced my own reunion. Jesus was saddened by his people's lack of faith. I found this quite funny because, if Jesus couldn't get the appropriate recognition for his great gifts and teachings on his homecoming, what hope do the rest of us have under the same circumstances? I guess this passage teaches us to watch our own prejudices and preconceptions when dealing with our judgement of people. The greatest wisdom, and our own understanding of God, often comes from the most unlikely places. My favourite part of being the Sydney Community Development Worker was to hear all of the stories of our amazing, and unassuming, older folk.

So how did my reunion go? Well, I was astonished and humbled by how many lovely women greeted and remembered me. I felt so honoured to spend time with my old friends and classmates – catching up and recalling so many funny stories. Dressed in Target pregnancy wear, I definitely did not win the fashion stakes, but then again I doubt most of us really had much time to notice what we wore or how many wrinkles we had accumulated. I reconnected with great old buddies, still avoided some of the tougher girls and even felt sorry for some of the better-off women who had attended prestigious senior schools and who now looked really bitter and self-absorbed (and rather lonely).

Was I a success? Of course that was the wrong question all along. As I roamed around that evening, I did feel happy with the person that I had grown into and I did feel that, through much blood, sweat and tears, I was finally pretty happy with my lot in life. Was the night a success for me? Happily, yes. Not because I could impress and beguile, but because I giggled and laughed most of the night with so many old friends like the silly schoolgirl I still really am. Do I plan to go to the next reunion in two years' time? Yes, probably. I'll know who is going, as we all are on Facebook now (but I'll need to lose some weight first).

Not really a spiritual piece this time; just one with spirit and a bit of soul.

Community Care

What a busy time of year this is turning out to be! In between visiting many people, I have submitted three grants (in under a week!) and I am organising the Women's Pamper Day and Foodbank along with a new program, "Multicultural Masterclass". Participants will have the opportunity to learn to cook a three-course meal from four different cultures represented in Melbourne – Italian, Middle Eastern, Kenyan and Vietnamese. This program will be held in the Bentleigh Hall and is proudly sponsored by the Victorian Multicultural Commission.

I was recently in Sydney with **Mark Herrmann** and I am pleased to have been involved in hiring our new Sydney Community Support Worker, **Jan Johnson**. I know you will make her feel welcome and I look forward very much to working closely with her.

Our **Foodbank** should be close to up and running by the time this edition of *Templer Talk* is sent out. Despite my best efforts, we have had to pay someone to build shelving in the Bayswater Hall and I am most grateful to Bunnings Bayswater for a \$100 donation towards the materials.

We have been collecting food from Foodbank Victoria in Dandenong, and we welcome *any* donations of non-perishable food or toiletry items once we are open for business. I have applied for a grant to purchase a freezer, so we can also have cold and frozen foods on offer. If you are able to, please donate a tin of food, some toilet paper, baby food or pet food – anything that would benefit people living in challenging circumstances who need a little help to get back on their feet.

It is not our intention to give a hand-out, but, rather, a hand up. Attached to the Foodbank we intend to run a Community Hub, where people can come and have a hot drink, make use of the computer to look for work, access the Care Worker and have a place to chat to others and rest in comfort.

TTHA

It has been a very busy month for TTHA with the end of the financial year, preparations for our upcoming Accreditation, finalising a number of projects around the Home, including installing new medical equipment throughout, and developing new Care Documentation. I cannot believe we are already half-way through the year.

Our yearly *Weihnachtsmarkt* is on November 24. This year the market will be bigger again, with many more stallholders wanting to be a part of the festive day, so make sure you place the date in your calendar and come to enjoy the pretzels, Christmas crafts and decorations, coffee, cakes, German sausages for lunch and the TTHA German Beer Garden.

We are also getting ready for our IT rollout at the end of August. New computers are being installed throughout the nurses' stations and brand new servers will run our whole IT infrastructure. Throughout the week of installation, a number of staff members will be working in different areas to encourage interaction between teams and to provide our employees with a greater understanding of what it takes to ensure our Home runs smoothly each day.

We have been very fortunate to employ a number of new care staff members to help cover the permanent shifts and provide more consistency with the care we provide. Please make them welcome when you see them.

It's at this time of year that we sadly say goodbye to our wonderful international volunteers. We have had such a fantastic group this year - Lennart, Kerstin, Suzanne, Jacqui, Adrian, Peter, Tim, Ann-Sophie, Helena, Simon, Freddie, Annika and Alois - and would like to thank them from the bottom of our hearts. Tragically, Alois was killed in a motorbike accident on his last adventure before returning home. May he rest in peace, even though he was taken far too early.

In relation to Accreditation, I thought I would give a quick overview of what is expected from the TTHA by the Department of Health and Ageing, as residential aged care facilities are required to be accredited to receive Australian Government funding. The Auditors assess TTHA's performance against a set of legislated Accreditation Standards every three years, with spot checks throughout the three-year period. These spot checks can be on predetermined dates or unannounced visits, so, here at TTHA, we continue to strive to be the best we can be every day. TTHA must be compliant in all four standards and the 44 associated outcomes to continue to receive funding in providing care to our residents. We are very proud to have been awarded the Commendable award when Accreditation was first introduced, and we have passed every assessment since. The four specific standards are:

Standard 1 – Management systems, staffing and organisational development

Standard 2 – Health and personal care

Standard 3 – Resident lifestyle

Standard 4 – Physical environment and safe systems

We have recently conducted an internal audit to ensure we are compliant in all these areas and, although there were a few recommendations, we are happy with the result. Recommendations are always positive and help with our continuous improvement plans. The Auditors will be interviewing residents, relatives, employees and contractors on their two-day visit, which is a great way to get face-to-face feedback instead of just viewing documentation.

We are very proud to have a solid waiting list for Residential Care and Retirement Living. This ensures 100% occupancy the majority of time. We thank all our residents, relatives and friends for their continuing support and recommendations. Word-of-mouth and personal experiences are always the best form of marketing. Please endeavour to let people know about TTHA and our services in Residential Care, Retirement Living, Community Care in your home and our wonderful Daily Activity groups.
