Reflection: In God's Hand

Herta Uhlherr, with reference to Peter Lange in *Die Warte*, May 2014

We come to see that life is fragile, with so many questions.

“The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord” laments Job when he is told that his house and his herds are lost, and that his servants and all his children have been killed (Job 1:21). Job’s words are still used in certain funeral rites and when a dreadful blow has somehow to be accepted.

If fate dealt us a shocking blow, how would we react? Like Job? Or would we be more likely to blame human failing – our own, or someone else’s – or the fury of nature? We can’t make “God” responsible for all the blows the billions of people on this planet suffer, as if “he” were obliged to remove all obstacles from every individual’s path. Would humans then ever learn, and grow spiritually, and develop compassion and resilience?

We do marvel at the way strong faith in a good God’s wise ways helped the early Templer settlers to bear the death of loved ones, especially of so many children. As many death notices testify, they were confident that the hour of our death is in God’s hand.

Many of us no longer have the stoic, almost fatalistic acceptance our forefathers had. We are more likely to look for earthly reasons why an accident or other crisis has happened to us, and try to do our bit to alleviate suffering in our world where we can.

“The Lord has taken away” does not resonate with **Peter Lange**; he can relate more readily to “the Lord gave”. Job’s loss is enormous and he wishes he were dead, but he does say later, “Shall we accept good from God, and not trouble?” (Job 2:10).

Peter refers to an early Templer who saw his life as guided by the benign hand of God. He had come to the realisation that a deeply spiritual life and the “high art of suffering” were made possible by seeing that everything, through which the Divine communicates with us every hour and every day, must work together for our good.

Seeing the Divine in this way comes from a firmly grounded faith and implies that we are wanted by God. It goes deeper than Job’s lament. God does not cause our suffering, he accompanies us in our suffering, or even “carries us” as in the poem *Footprints*.

Do we tap into our inner strength? Are we open to the insight that, as “temples”, we are at one with the powerful energy we call God within us and can be empowered by consciously connecting with it?

We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. Romans 8:28.

Funeral Charges

After much deliberation, the Elders who conduct funerals have moved to institute a fee structure rather than the "donation system" previously employed. This has come about for a number of reasons.

Funeral Directors regularly make provision for a "minister's fee" and similarly for a pianist if accompaniment is provided at the funeral service. For religious and civil celebrants this is the norm. To "undo" such an arrangement can be awkward for all parties concerned.

And, while families are generous in making a donation to the TSA after a funeral, it can be difficult to settle on an "appropriate" amount. Making it a "fee for service", with the charging rates below, avoids this difficulty.

Celebrants make themselves available at short notice in sensitive and difficult times. Travel is often involved in the initial planning, as well as the delivery of a suitable ceremony. Consultation via various media is important throughout the process. The Elder also provides liaison with the Funeral Director and office duties in preparing and delivering the funeral. Much time and effort is expended to try to give the family the service they desire for their departed loved one.

However, in all cases, it must be emphasised that any bereaved family not in a position to make payment will not be disadvantaged and suitable solutions will always be found.

Elder conducting funeral: **\$400** (plus GST)

Pianist providing musical accompaniment: **\$60** (plus GST)

The Elders are keen to provide some certainty around an occasion that can be very stressful, emotional and challenging. Any concerns can always be raised with the funeral celebrant or the TSA Office.
